Doing Recycling Better

When given the opportunity, we all like to do things better. At Cloquet Sanitary/North Country Waste and Recycling and Cloquet Riverside Recycling we are always looking for better ways to do our job. We not only want to offer the best customer service to our community, we want to do our best to protect our environment.

We have found that single stream recycling (putting all recycling into one bin without sorting) is not the most efficient way to protect our earth. Statistics show that about 1/3 of all single stream

recycling ends up in the garbage. What does end up getting recycled is still contaminated. Paper and cardboard gets embedded with crushed glass.

Recently, Anheiser-Busch, as a buyer of aluminum cans, has been rejecting loads of processed aluminum cans because of glass contamination from both the single stream and dual stream recycling programs.

So the next time you go out of your way to sort your plastics, aluminum, cardboard, etc. know that you are helping to ensure the best quality recycling is happening and less is contaminating our ground.

Cloquet Sanitary began in 1953 and the Crestik family acquired ownership in November 1971 as a one truck operation. Many remember Duane's friendly face and commitment to customer service. He was always willing to go the extra mile to ensure customer satisfaction.

Today we continue the same commitment to customer service with a staff of approximately 20 who share that same value.

Since 1971 much has changed in the solid waste removal business. In the early days we used to dump everything in one truck and haul it to the landfill— out

of sight; out of mind. But since that time, we have partnered with the community and are being better stewards of our environment. To accomplish that purpose, we made a big commitment to recycling in 1990 by opening a recycling center and providing recycling collection services for residents and businesses. We also offer hauling services for demolition and household clean up with our drop box services (5-40 yards).

An additional service is collection and removal of appliances, car tires, and electronics.
